

Please join us in making a Blue and White or Blue and Cream quilt for the Challenge this year. Sapphire is the name for a 45th Anniversary which is how old the Utah Quilt Guild is in 2022. Please follow these rules:

- Colors: Blue and White or Blue and Cream (no black, but dark navy is allowed.)
- Definition of a Quilt: 3 layer – top, batting, backing
- Size: 12 inches to 108 inches per side
- Quilt must be completed in 2022. Please do not submit quilts completed in 2021 or earlier.
- Definition of completed – bound with label attached

All Fabric provided

From the stoplight on State St 89, turn east on Maple St towards the mountain. Go almost to the end and her house is in the large gated property on the left. (It has an airplane in the yard.) You will go on a little access lane past a neighbor's house to the gated entrance and can park within the property. The front door is straight ahead. There is also a walkway and door to the left of the main entrance where you can enter and go down the stairs to the basement.

[Note: If you are bringing a sewing machine and need to use the elevator, then enter in the front door.]

Plan on removing your shoes and bringing your own lunch.

This is an easy pattern by Karen Brown of Just get it done Quilts.

Actually, they don't turn out ugly at all! Old and out-dated fabric can still keep people warm.

Digging deep into our fabric donations unearths many treasures from the past. This pattern is a quick, easy way to use up these oldies but goodies into much needed larger quilts.



The 'Ugly' Quilt

Fabric Requirements

Lap Size

- 12 fabrics at least 14" square
- 5 x 2 1/2" strips WOF for binding
- 1 1/2 yards of fabric for back

Quilt finished 36" x 48"



Ugly Fabrics

This quilt is great for using up those fabrics in your stash that you'll never want to use. They might not be in your colour zone. They may not be your kind of pattern. Or you have simply matured as a quilter and realized that they no longer fit with the projects that you like to make.

This is one quilt where you don't need to worry about matching patterns, colours or values. In my video about this quilt I did chose to alter light and dark fabric in my stacks but that was only a personal choice. The quilt in the above photo had no order at all.

Cutting

- Press all your fabrics
- Stack all your fabrics on top of each other aligning the sides along the selvage. You do not need fat quarters. Any pieces at least 14" square will do
- Square up the bottom and remove the selvages
- Cut the stack into a 14" square. Use a large, sharp rotary cutter.





Making the Blocks

- On the left hand side of the block, cut the stack diagonally from bottom to top
- Take the fabric from the top of the right side and place it on the bottom
- Pair the sides together and sew. Be careful while sewing not to pull on the seam. This is a bias seam.
- Press and re-stack the blocks



- Repeat on the right hand side of the block by cutting the stack diagonally from bottom to top
- Take the fabric from the top of the right side and place it on the bottom
- Pair the sides together and sew.
- Press and re-stack the blocks




Making the Quilt Top


- Trim all blocks to 12.5" . You may also trim your blocks smaller if necessary as long as all blocks are the same size
- Lay the blocks out in 4 rows by 3 columns.
- Sort your blocks until you are pleased with the layout. DON'T OVERTHINK THIS
- Sew Columns together
- Sew rows together

3 Columns

By 4 Rows



- This quilt block is so versatile. You can make blocks of virtually any size. Use layer cakes, old fat quarters or any large scraps too.
- Remember that your blocks will finish at least 1/2" smaller for every cut made. And allow another 1/2" to 1" for trimming.



- Instead of cutting all your stack the same, you can divide your stacks into several smaller ones.
- You can make a larger quilt with 48" x 60" with same block by using 20 fabrics, 4 columns by 5 rows

Finishing

- This quilts requires no fancy quilting. Basic swirls, stipling or wavy lines all work well
- Use your 'ugly' fabric to make your backing and binding too

Lynnette Rose uses a headlamp to see her English Paper Piecing. This works much better than a lamp to the side. It directs light right where you are working. These have an elastic headband, to fit comfortably. Many have it so you can change the angle to shine directly on what you want to see.



Trish Derrick suggested using a small piece of batting to the side of her machine to catch stray threads.
