President's Message




The Patchwords Newsletter Published eleven times a year (Jan—Nov) and emailed to current members of the Utah Valley Quilt Guild.


June Meeting

June will be a round robin!





Kentucky Derby Pie (Authentic Recipe)

You don't need a horse race to make this Kentucky Derby pie!
This sweet treat is part pecan pie, part chocolate chip cookie, and full of perfection!

Ingredients

- 1 (9-inch) pastry pie crust
- 1 cup light corn syrup
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 4 eggs
- 1 1/4 cups chocolate chips
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 1/2 cup butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons bourbon, optional
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Instructions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Press the pastry pie crust firmly into a 9-inch pie plate. In a large bowl, beat the corn syrup, sugar, and eggs with an electric mixer at medium speed until well combined.

Gently mix in the chocolate chips, pecans, melted butter, bourbon (if using), and vanilla.

Pour the pie filling into the prepared crust. Bake for 45 to 50 minutes, or until the filling has set. Cool it completely on a wire rack before slicing. Serve it warm or chilled with ice cream or whipped

cream. Enjoy!
