President's Message – November, 2023

Dear UVQG Members,

This year is winding down, and I would like to take the opportunity to thank all the Guild Members for their support. Especially, I would like to thank the Board Members for their over-the-top dedication and support to quilting, the UVQG, the Quilt Retreat at Zermatt, the Quilts for Donations, July Fair at the Red Barn, and myself. It would never have been such a great year without your total dedication. Having said that, I would like to say something about The Spirit of Volunteerism. Is that a word? As Kim starts preparing for 2024, sadly there are many open spots on the Board. We have over 250 members and we are desperate for Volunteers! We have open positions for July Fair Chairman (The Red Barn is already secured), Retreat Chairman (Barb M said she would help you), Treasurer, Retreat Registrar, Retreat Secret Sister Chairman, and more of whom I may not be aware.

So here is something Kim and I discussed while attending The Utah Girls Retreat in Hamilton, MO. We have lots of members who enjoy the perks of their

membership but who do not attend or do anything to help out the Guild. So what can we do to encourage more members to help out? I am saying to the entire Guild Membership that next year's Retreat at Zermatt (which BTW has the contract ready and signed) will possibly only accept members who are active in the Guild. That is you attend at least 2 meetings during the year and/or are a member of the Board. There are positions that can be handled by a twosome or threesome of friends who can do the volunteer work. Our guild meeting for November will be a week earlier than usual. It will be held Wednesday, **November 8** at 1:30 at the Orem Friendship Center. This month's meeting will include our annual book sale and show and tell. The program will be a celebration of improv with a quilt show of this year's president-elect challenge quilts. Three ribbons will be given for viewer's choice awards. Remember that any size quilt is acceptable, as long as you have used improv techniques to create the pattern. Quilted garments are also acceptable. To be eligible for a ribbon, it must be completed. We hope you are as excited as we are to see your wonderful creations. See you on November 8th!

Those who are bringing improv quilts to the guild meeting should plan to arrive by 1:15 to help set up their quilt on a quilt stand. There will be stands set up with sheets attached where small quilts and quilted garments can be attached with pins. Numbers will be attached to each entry to make voting easier. Attendees can look at quilts and vote for their favorites from 1:30 to 2:00 (approx). During the meeting, quilt entrants will be given a minute or so to talk about his/her piece.


Schedule of Events

2:40 - winners are announced, refreshments are served and the book sale resumes


3:00 - book sale ends




Habitat for Humanity
