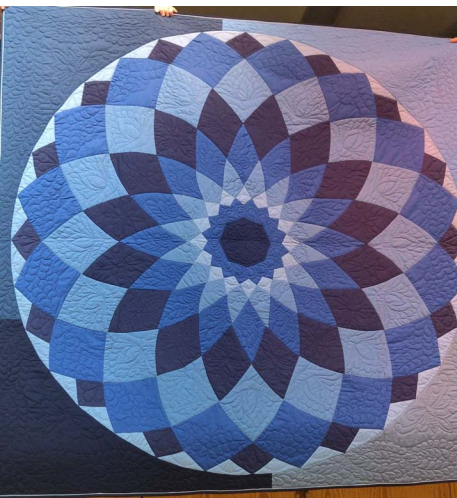
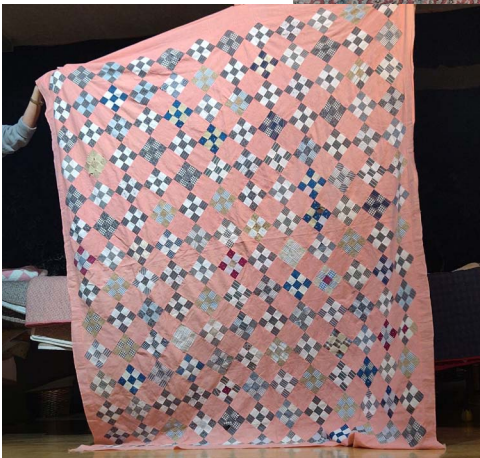
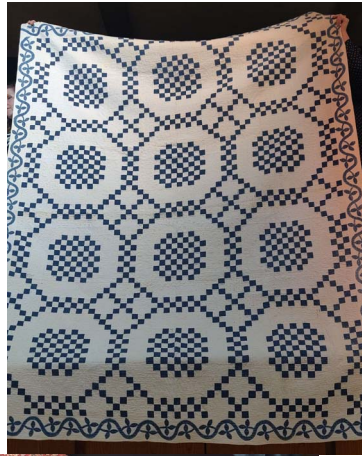

Please join us in making a Blue and White or Blue and Cream quilt for the Challenge this year. Sapphire is the name for a 45th Anniversary which is how old the Utah Quilt Guild is in 2022. Please follow these rules:

- Colors: Blue and White or Blue and Cream (no black, but dark navy is allowed.)
- Definition of a Quilt: 3 layer – top, batting, backing
- Size: 12 inches to 108 inches per side
- Quilt must be completed in 2022. Please do not submit quilts completed in 2021 or earlier.
- Definition of completed – bound with label attached

Service Projects

Donation Progress for 2022

As of April 25, 2022, I have dropped off 61 completed quilts, 6 fleece blankets, 2 scarves, and 25 minkee foot-balls to local organizations. In addition to that, 17 pre-cut quilt kits were donated to the afterschool quilt club at Mt Nebo Middle School and 20 enveloped tops provided to Mutual Dell camp for them to tie. We are well on our way to our goal of 222 quilts for the year and all the other stuff is just a bonus.

Four Patch Quilt Pattern (pattern on next page)

We adapted this great pattern to use with flannel at our service day activity.

This pattern lends itself well to the envelope method of finishing quilts because the finished top measures about the same size as the width of the flannel. At the service activity, five of these tops were sewn together

Here are the changes we made:

- Instead of a narrow border and a wide border, we cut four strips at 5 inches for a single border. I don't like to cut flannel smaller than 3 ½ inches.
- We pieced the four patch units from the donated scraps already cut into 3 1/2" squares. These were scrappy and mismatched for the most part, but by using a solid, constant fabric for the 6 ½ inch alternating squares, it calms it down and gives a unified look.

Your kit should include the following:

15 - 6 1/2" squares of focus/print fabric

3 - 3 1/2" strips of fabric A

3 - 3 1/2" strips of fabric B

4 - 1 1/2" strips of Inner Border Fabric

4 - 3 1/2" strips of Outer Border Fabric (could be matching or complementary focus fabric)

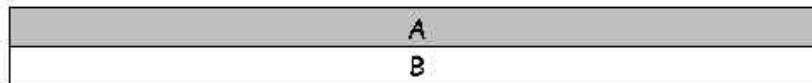
Backing Fabric - Please only use the fabric provided
Do not substitute

Use good quality thread (not clear mono-filament as it melts in dryer)

Assembling the Blocks: Remember - a 1/4" seam allowance is used for all seams.

The A and B strips are cut the same size as the outer border strips. Please make sure to use the correct strips when assembling the blocks.

1. Sew one A strip and one B strip together to make a strip set as shown below. Press toward the darker fabric. You will make three of these strip sets.



2. Cut these strip sets into 30 units that measure 3 1/2" x 6 1/2". Sew these units together to create 15 four-patch blocks that will measure 6 1/2" square.



30 - 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" units



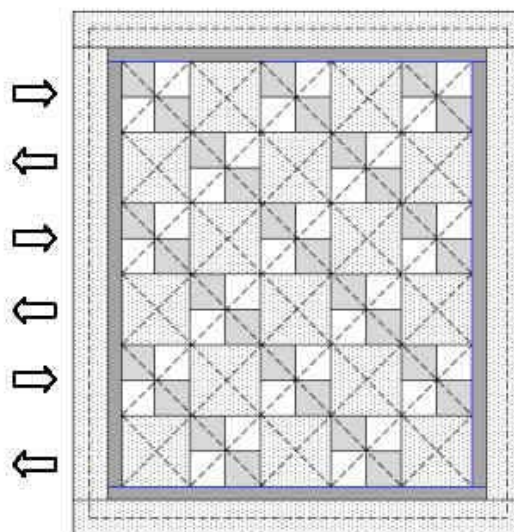
15 - 6 1/2" four-patch blocks

Assembling the Quilt:

1. After the four-patch blocks are assembled, lay out your blocks alternating them with the 6 1/2" focus fabric blocks in a checkerboard pattern as shown in the diagram on the next page. Make sure your 4-patch blocks are all set in the same direction to create diagonal lines across the quilt.
2. Sew the blocks in each row together and press the seams in the direction indicated in the diagram.
3. Sew rows 1-6 together. (OVER)

4. Add the side inner borders first. Then add the top and bottom inner borders.
5. Add your outer borders in the same manner as the inner borders, first adding the side borders and then adding the top and bottom borders. Your quilt top should look like the diagram below.
6. **BATTING:** Use only 1/8 - 1/4 inch **LOW LOFT** batting. Baste the quilt layers (either with safety pins or a needle and thread) then **MACHINE** quilt. This quilt will be loved and washed a lot so **make sure that there's lots of quilting to hold up to daily hospital washings.** Quilt in the borders as well. Bind the quilt as you normally would. "Pillowcase" the quilt before quilting or use traditional binding, or fold the backing to the front of the quilt. To use backing as a binding, cut the batting even with the top of the quilt and the backing an inch larger. Double fold backing to front of the quilt and topstitch. A **Zig-Zag** stitch will help keep binding edges down so won't snag on I.V. Keep binding on front of the quilt to $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide. **REMOVE ALL PINS!** No hand tied quilts.
7. Sign the label with a permanent fabric marker. Place label on **BACK** of quilt and machine sew around all four sides.
8. Wash and dry the completed quilt. Ship the finished quilt to Quilts for Kids headquarters. Your quilt will bring joy to a child in need. **CHECK FOR PINS!**

Suggested Straight Line Quilting

We recommend quilting in the ditch horizontally and vertically between all blocks and also diagonally as shown in the diagram. Don't forget to quilt around the inner border and add some quilting to the outer border.

If desired, you may choose to do an all-over meander or design.

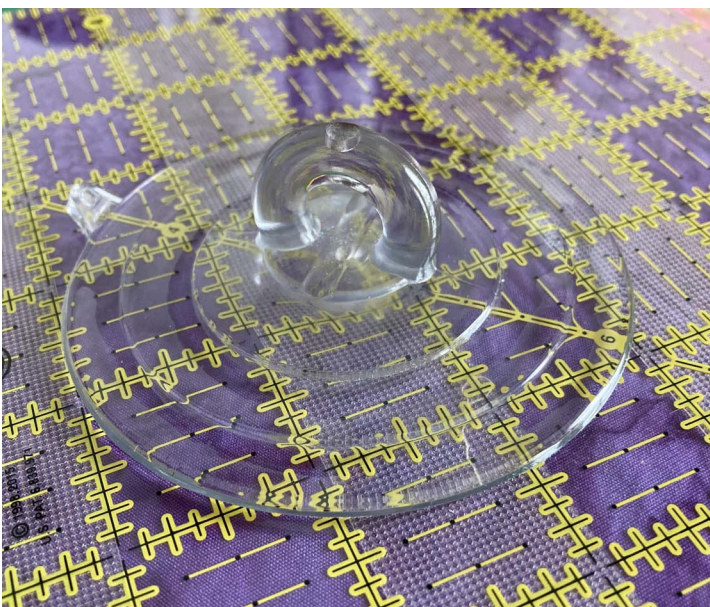

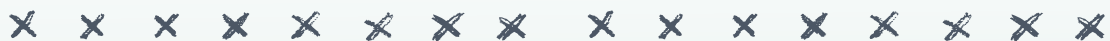

Block of the Month

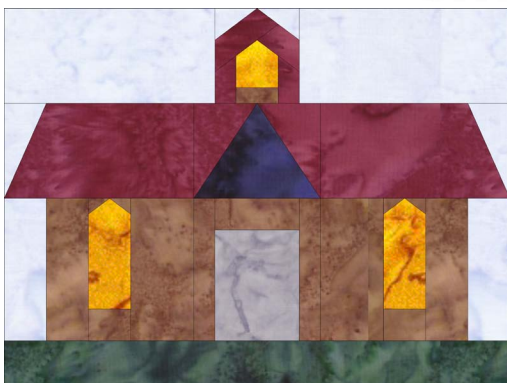
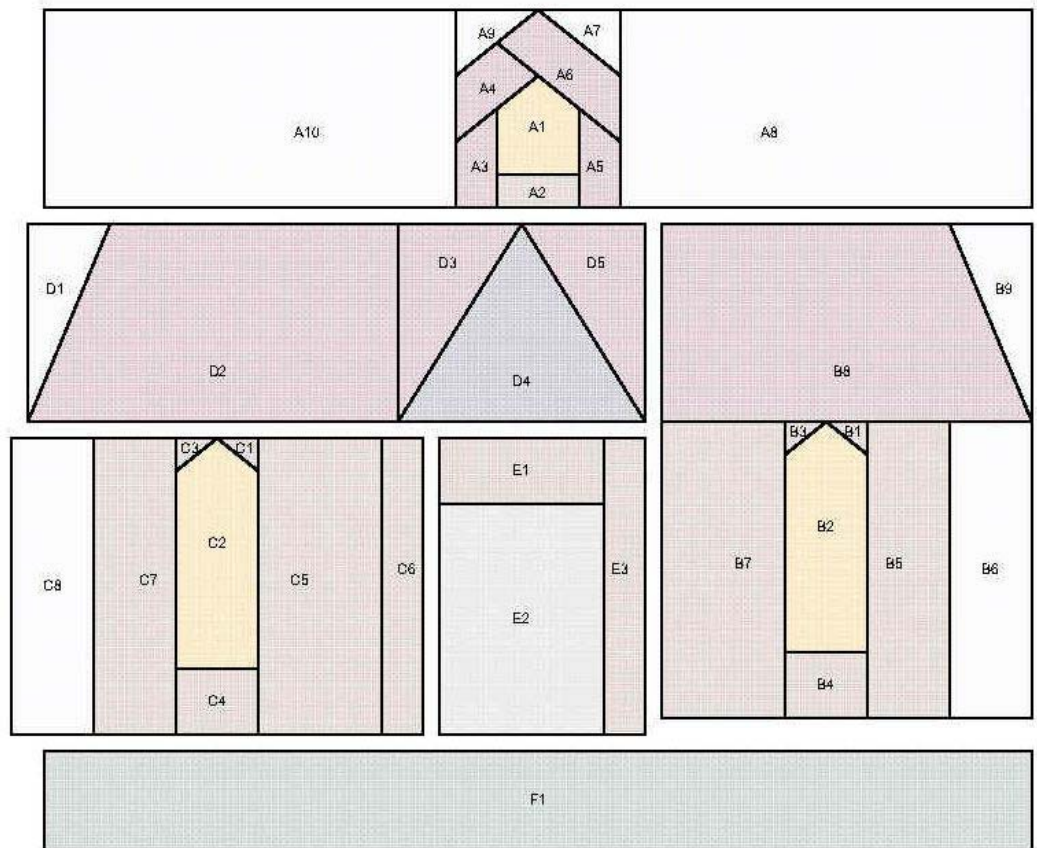

One with the pieced border (105" square, King size) and one without the pieced border (80" square). This is a patriotic theme quilt called "America". It looks difficult until you break it down into monthly segments. Paper-pieced and rotary cut. You do not have to do this quilt. It is for your enjoyment only.

Rules: Each month there will be a link for you to download. The segment will only be available during that month. All requests for back issues will be ignored. Once the entire quilt pattern is completed, it will become a for sale item in my Etsy Store under LadybugLines. This is offered free of charge to the members of UVQG.
