Vendor Booth Rentals: \$540.00

Bake Sale \$412.31

Sale of Booklets \$231.50

Garage Sale \$1572.05

Silent Auction \$774.00

We do have expenses with the July Fair but all of the receipts have not been turned in yet. We should be approximately at \$2900.00 for profit for 2019. This amount is very similar to the amount of profit we had in 2018.

Thank you to all who attended, bought, and supported the Utah Valley Quilt Guild.

This month we have an amazing opportunity to visit the Springville Art Museum Quilt Show. Many of our guild members have entered quilts in this show and some have received awards. 

Stitching with Wool - a special presentation by the "Midway Wool" by "My Girlfriends quilt shoppe"

Don't you just love the look and feel of a wool quilt? I do and they are soooo easy to do. Did you know that wool is naturally mold, mildew, wrinkle, and flame resistant. What more could you ask for? Wool is a great fabric to make quilts that become family heirlooms. Come to the August Utah Valley Quilt Guild meeting and learn what you need to do to make one of these wonderful quilts. Learn the Magnificent embroidery stitches to embellish your project.

This will be a hands on meeting with kits to work on. You will need to bring a few items if you want to work with our great teachers. A small pair of scissors, needle and threads (This is just a learning sample so bring a variety of thread colors.)

Kits will need to be picked up at the door as you come in. Cost is \$ (???? We need to know what the kit needs and costs. fill in and delete red before printing) You will need to bring exact cash. 


November Retreat






