## Service Spotlight: Days for Girls

Did you know that May 28 is Menstrual Hygiene Day? (5 days average duration for a woman's period + 28 days of an average woman's cycle = 5/28)

Days for Girls (DfG) is a nonprofit organization that prepares and distributes sustainable menstrual health solutions to girls who would otherwise miss school during their monthly periods.

While this group is not quilt-related, many of our members use their sewing talents to help this cause. They also accept fabric donations! If you have bright color fabrics,  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch ribbon, or serging threads to donate, they would love to have them. They will accept soft, super-absorbent cotton flannel and they prefer darker, colorful fabric which will hide stains better.

- Thread should be 100% cotton not white and not black
- Ribbon for drawstrings
- Fabric 100% cotton, prewashing is helpful



- Multi colored or dark, no animals or eyes (except butterflies are ok) No camouflage or flags
- Flannel is for the liners at least 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  wide
- Other cloth for shields and bags

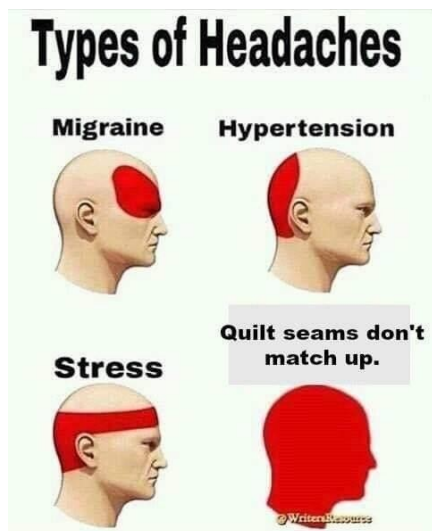

# Springville Museum of Art 2021 Quilt Show July 17- Sept 18, 2021

This juried exhibition features quilts of all styles and sizes created by some of the State's finest quilters. Presented by the Springville Museum of Art and the Utah Valley Quilt Guild with support from the Corn Wagon Quilt Company.

This beautiful show is open to anyone who currently lives in Utah, or who has ever lived in Utah. Quilts must not be made from a kit (full or partial) where the pattern and the fabric are packaged together, must be no longer than 120", must have not been previously entered into this show and must be **three years old or younger**. (The quilt, not the quilter.)

Remember to follow the instructions for the special hanging sleeve for this show— without it your quilt cannot be accepted. Please read the entry requirements and specifications on the website. Online entry forms are available at [www.smofa.org](http://www.smofa.org). This form needs to be filled out online before bringing your quilt to the museum.

The area available for the show was enlarged by the SMOA in 2018, so this means we need even more entries to fill the space. We need your beautiful work, quilters! An individual can submit up to 2 quilts of all colors and designs. Entries will be accepted online beginning June 14th, with quilts brought in person on Friday, July 9 and Sat, July 10, 2021. (Be prepared to follow social distancing guidelines.)

Entry fees are \$16.00 per quilt, payable to the SMOA.

Quality in workmanship, design, color, originality, and general appeal will be the principal criteria ap-

plied by the selection committee for admission to the show. The same criteria will also be used by the judges. There will be awards for "Best of Show", "Best Hand Quilting," as well as many other awards.
