
### OREM SENIOR FRIENDSHIP CENTER



The Springville Quilt Show is just a little more than a half month away! Plan to enter one or two of your quilts in this beautiful show. Basic information about the show, the eligibility requirements, and directions for the special hanging sleeve are all on the museum website [www.smofa.org](http://www.smofa.org). Scroll down on the home page and click on "Upcoming Exhibitions." Next click on "44th Annual Quilt Show." The online entry form will be available through July 22nd. The museum is asking entrants to fill out the form online at least 24 hours before bringing their quilts to the museum on July 21st or July 22nd between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. The entry form is easy to fill out and will allow you to write a 100 word history of your quilt. Entry fees of \$15 per quilt may be paid by credit card online or by check or cash when bringing your quilts to the museum.. The Springville Show is a juried show which means that a committee will decide which quilt entries will be hung in the show. Quilts are selected based on several factors such as the following: Correct hanging sleeve, quality workmanship, good visual impact, and available space. This year, the Traveling Ruby Jubilee show will be in the large back room where we usually hang the larger quilts. The judged show will be in the rest of the main floor of the museum. If your quilt entry is larger than 109" x 109", please check with me (801-224-3022) for available space before paying the non-refundable entry fee.




## UVQG Library—



### **Recipe of the Month - Personalized Fortune Cookies (think quilt friends & retreats)**

#### **YOU WILL NEED:**

- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup of flour
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup of sugar
- 1 egg white
- 6-7 drops of vanilla extract (or any other extract that you like)
- Food color (optional)
- Pinch of salt
- Prepared notes
- Muffin pan
- Baking sheet
- An empty glass




#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. Preheat the oven at 200°C/400°F and prepare your notes before you start baking the cookies. You will have no time for cutting the notes once you take them out of the oven.
2. Beat egg whites until stiff, then add vanilla extract (or any other extract), flour, sugar, and salt. Mix it well.
3. If you want your cookies to be colorful, now is the time to add some food color. I always make several different colors in different bowls, because some colors are working better than the others. In my experience, yellow works the best. But feel free to experiment. Be careful, though, the colors will stain everything (including your skin), so make sure to keep the mixture in the bowl and use the spoon when adding colors.
4. Once you are satisfied with the color, prepare the baking sheet and using the spoon, create thin circles. Make 2-3 cookies at the time, because you will have to bend them pretty fast once they are done.
5. Bake for about 5 minutes, depending on your oven. Make sure not to leave them for too long, or else they will crack instead of bend.
6. Now this is where you will have to act fast. Watch your fingers, because this will be hot! Take out the flat cookies using a spatula and flip it on the other side. Put the note in the middle and fold the cookie in half. Place the folded end of the cookie on the edge of the class, so you can make a fortune cookie shape. Immediately place the cookie in the muffin pan. This will keep the shape of the cookie as it cools down. If you don't have this pan, you can always place the cookies in small cups, but muffin pan is the right size and it has a lot of space. Repeat the process.


