Please join us in making a Blue and White or Blue and Cream quilt for the Challenge this year. Sapphire is the name for a 45<sup>th</sup> Anniversary which is how old the Utah Quilt Guild is in 2022. Please follow these rules:

- Colors: Blue and White or Blue and Cream (no black, but dark navy is allowed.)
- Definition of a Quilt: 3 layer – top, batting, backing
- Size: 12 inches to 108 inches per side
- Quilt must be completed in 2022. Please do not submit quilts completed in 2021 or earlier.
- Definition of completed – bound with label attached

- 1) Sarah Yorgason showed the “Ugly Quilt” from Karen Brown that we will be sewing for our service activity in October.
- 2) Gloria Pendlebury showed a small star wall hanging. It had a blue background with a white vintage star.
- 3) Tricia Tolton showed the quilt made with fabric she won at retreat.
- 4) Mary Snow’s quilt is “Snowflake.” She designed all the snowflakes. The inspiration came from her last name, Snow.
- 5) Mary also showed “America the Beautiful” which she started in 2012. The pattern was in McCall’s magazine.
- 6) Carrie Hanks showed “Scrappy Stars.” She loves scraps and used up a lot of her colored scraps so she used black, white, and gray for the back. This is one of the first quilts she has quilted on her regular sewing machine.
- 7) Carrie Hanks “Halloween Row by Row” was a challenge with two of her friends. They made 24-inch rows then swapped and put them together. She quilted all three.
- 8) Mabelle Preston showed “Mauna Kea” made with batiks. She made another one with darker colors that was a gift to the Bishop of the Lihue Ward.
- 9) Mabelle also showed “Cherry Wreath” made with a Minick & Simpson pattern. She wanted to make this one since she grew up on a cherry tree farm.
- 10) Debbie Jackson showed “Petal Play” which was a BOM from Kates Quilting Block. She appliqued the flower petals and center. She did a blanket stitch edge because it looked “older.”
- 11) Debbie Proctor showed six quilts. First was “Quartered Stripes” made with blues and green from a Jenny Doan video. Second was a log cabin made with scrappy fabrics for Stitchin’ Hearts. Next was a charity strip quilt with unicorn fabric. Then was sashed squares made with deer fabric for Stitchin’ Hearts from their scraps. Last was “Timber” made with rainbow blocks with scraps from Stitchin’ Hearts.
- 12) Last was Nancy Palmer. Her quilt was done for a paint chip challenge from her guild in Draper.

# GIVING UPDATE

As of October 1, our donation total for 2022 has reached 130 quilts and 187 stuffed items. (bears and footballs)

Special thanks to Sandy Lai's sister for transporting 30 quilts to flood victims in Kentucky. After record flooding at the end of July in eastern Kentucky, residents reported more than 10,000 homes damaged or destroyed. Many residents remain in housing limbo as they apply for aid and rebuild. Our donation is a small drop in the bucket for those affected.

On Friday, September 9, the Many Hands Bee met at Sandy Lai's home. We completed 30 flannel receiving blankets which will be donated to local organizations.

Guild member Laura Brown oversaw the quilt tying this summer at Mutual Dell summer camp and reports that they want to continue the project next summer. This has been a great way to encourage the next generation of quilters and provide valuable exposure to the art of quilting. Through donations of time and materials, the guild provided Mutual Dell with 35 enveloped quilt tops ready for tying. Many of the tops were prepared at our March service activity and we plan to do the same in March 2023.



# Quilter's Corner

## Are you A Twister?

Do you twist your needle just a little bit as you sew on your binding, English paper piecing, or other hand sewing? Does your thread knot and do whoop-de-dooos before going through your fabric?


Just drop the needle (while still on the thread) and let it dangle for a second or two below your project. It will naturally untwist and come to rest in the best position to start sewing again.

This month is the Flag. Most of it is paper pieced because of the angles. The “star” portion can be either paper-pieced or rotary cut using Peaky & Spike rulers. I use the Peaky & Spike set by Marti Mitchell.
