We are always striving to improve and make the guild the best it can be, so if you have any comments or suggestions, please feel free to contact any member of the board.





Many Hands Helps Women in Kenya



Written by Guest Contributor Aliza, a BYU student who contacted the guild for help with the women's clinic. We provided 46 serged fleece blankets and 435 flannel sanitary pads that were made at our March service meeting.

The Shaka community in Kilifi County, Kenya is an extremely remote community without access to healthcare, a grocery store, or a fabric store for several kilometers. The nearest medical facility is 20km away from the community. Before the construction of this clinic, many women would attempt to make the journey on foot or on a small motorbike called a pikipiki, sometimes even during labor. During the rainy season, the flooded roads make any other form of transportation nearly impossible. Many women would be unable to complete the journey and give birth in ditches on the side of the road. These were often filled with garbage and leeches.

The medical facility is well received by the community. Currently one doctor and one nurse are employed by the county to oversee the medical dispensary and maternity clinic. The two of them see between 50-100 patients daily each. They are averaging 1-2 births per day at the clinic. The community is so excited to receive the clinic. During construction, women would carry 5-gallon buckets of water on their heads almost a mile from the watering hole to the clinic. They would make this journey 6 times each morning before their regular chores began at sunrise. This truly shows their excitement for this clinic and dedication to helping improve their own healthcare anyway they can.

The baby blankets and the postpartum pads provided by the Utah Valley Quilters' Guild have been and will continue to be a great blessing to the community. Babies previously would often sleep on dirt floors, but now can sleep on a more comfortable blanket. Mothers have a way to control bleeding postpartum. The postpartum pads donated are projected to support the clinic and community for about a year. The baby

blankets are projected to support the clinic for several months. (Though use of the clinic is steadily increasing due to an ever-increasing need.)

Mothers previously had no sanitary items to clean themselves after giving birth. Washing themselves with a cloth from home or even in the local watering hole would often lead to leech and bacterial infections and further contaminate the water supply. Having a pad to manage the bleeding will keep these women and the community safe.

Babies now have a clean, soft place to sleep for the first few years of their lives. The blankets provide a lot more comfort than the dirt floors and will help babies feel safe and comfortable during their first few years.

Thank you, quilters, for your support to the Shaka community. Having seen their struggles and need for this facility and all of your donations, I am truly humbled. By their determination, work, and hope for their community. And also by you good people, your donation of time, talents, and resources. Few organizations could come together so quickly to support a need across the world.

Thank you so much for your generosity. I promise it has made a great difference to the Shaka community and will bless them for a long time going forward.
