President's Message by Lisa Johnson, UVQG President




Back to School

Whichever way you envision Back to School, let the school bells ring out for you!




UVQG Mission Statement

You can bring new quilts or gently used quilts (washed/cleaned) to Corn Wagon Quilts, Sewtopia, or Sarah Yorgason. They are hoping to get the quilts by September 24.

Cozy Brick Quilt Cut-Out

Wednesday, September 15
1:00 to 3:30
Orem Senior Center

If you are not going to attend the Utah Quilt Guild's Quilt fest, I invite you to come cut out flannel!

We have three plastic tubs full of pieces of plaid flannels.

This will make great donation quilts for The Refuge in Orem or for the Afghanistan refugees.

We will be pressing and cutting into big squares and rectangles and matching them with backing fabric.

Please bring:

- Rotary cutter with a sharp blade and marked with your name
- Cutting mat
- Ruler marked with your name
- Any fabric to donate if you have it

I have been cutting all flannel scraps into the biggest square possible and matching them together, but we are going to increase efficiency by adding rectangles.
